What was the turning point moment that changed your life

An Essay Competition to commemorate the 125th Anniversary of the eviction of Mahatma Gandhi from a 1^{st} class train compartment at Pietermaritzburg Railway Station on June 7, 1893.

The High Commission of India, Pretoria in association with Consulate General of India, Durban is holding an Essay Competition to commemorate the 125th anniversary of the eviction of Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi on June 7, 1893 at Pietermaritzburg Railway Station from first class train compartment for being a 'person of colour'. When Mahatma Gandhi was evicted from the train, an Indian visiting South Africa fell; but when Gandhi rose an Indian South African rose determined to fight against discrimination and injustice. Mahatma Gandhi spent that cold night in the waiting room of the station and instead of returning to India, he vowed to stay and fight the disease of racial prejudice. In later years Gandhi stated that that incident had changed the course of his life, stating: "My active non-violence began from that date".

The 7th June 1893 incident at the PMB Station was the turning point moment in the life of Mahatma Gandhi, father of the Indian nation. This historical moment was instrumental in transforming young Gandhi's life, from being an advocate in South Africa to a world leader who fought against colonial discrimination and injustice through his unique weapons of Non Violence and *Satyagraha* (Truth Force). In the spirit of this momentous transformation in Gandhiji's life, we are organising an essay competition on the topic "What is the Turning Point Moment in Your Life" to encourage young minds to pen down such life transforming events in their own lives. **Competition will be open from 15th April to 15th May 2018**. Entries are invited from all South African students from Grade 10 to 12. Relevant rules and details for participating in the Essay Competition are enclosed.

The top three winners of the competition will be given attractive prizes on 7th June 2018, in a grand event at Pietermaritzburg Railway station which is being held to commemorate the landmark 125th anniversary of this historical event. Hon'ble Minister of External Affairs, Government of India and Hon'ble Foreign Minister of South Africa along with other important dignitaries are expected to participate in the event.

We request educational institutions and young people to participate in large numbers.
